Dear all,

Happy New Year! Well, that's what we will be saying on Sunday. The first Sunday of Advent marks the start of a new year for the church. You may well think it's a strange time to start a new year but I think what better time than in anticipation of a birth. Without getting into the hotly debated details, I think we can all agree that a new baby's life does not begin only when they are born but in all the preparations to get ready for that birth and the biological growth that goes on in the preceding months. The events that happen in anticipation of that day of birth are actually where the story starts and so they also mark the beginning of a new year for us following Jesus. Preparing to celebrate his coming to live among us, his life and teaching and ultimately his death and resurrection defining our relationship with God. It is why many people have redefined the candles on an Advent Wreath – the tradition is that we light one more each Sunday as we draw nearer to Christmas Day and historically people have remembered first the patriarchs of our faith, then the prophets, then John the Baptist and finally Mary before we light the special central candle for the arrival of the light of the world – the Christ candle. But more recently people have found it helpful to focus on some core tenets of our faith as we prepare for a new year: Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. As we prepare ourselves for a new year of following Jesus let's take a moment each week to think how these characteristics of God are evident in our lives. What is it you hope for? How does God shape your hope?

All around us we observe a pregnant creation. The difficult times of pain throughout the world are simply birth pangs. But it's not only around us; it's within us. The Spirit of God is arousing us within. We're also feeling the birth pangs. These sterile and barren bodies of ours are yearning for full deliverance. That is why waiting does not diminish us, any more than waiting diminishes a pregnant mother. We are enlarged in the waiting. We, of course, don't see what is enlarging us. But the longer we wait, the larger we become, and the more joyful our expectancy.
